ORDER

AUTHORIZING ADOPTION OF BASTROP COUNTY POLLING PLACE REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Bastrop County directs and authorizes the Bastrop County Elections Department to hold elections in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Elections Code that provide for fair, ethical, and dignified elections; and,

WHEREAS, the Bastrop County Commissioners Court desires to conduct said elections with forthrightness, civility and orderliness.

WHEREAS, Bastrop County may not, at any time during the voting period, prohibit electioneering, but may enact reasonable regulations concerning the time, place, and manner of electioneering. "Electioneering" includes the posting, use, or distribution of political signs or literature.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Bastrop County Commissioners Court approves this Order adopting the Polling Place Regulations attached as Exhibit A to be in effect of all elections in Bastrop County.



BASTROP COUNTY POLLING PLACE REGULATIONS

- I. All Regular, General, Special, and Emergency Elections of the Bastrop County will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Elections Code.
- II. All Regular, General, Special and Emergency Elections of the Bastrop County will adhere to the regulations set forth herein to allow for reasonable campaigning without deterring and obstructing voters of their right to cast a ballot.
- III. No signs may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, using Texas Metal "T-Posts" such as those "T-Posts" customarily used for the construction of ranch fencing. Signs may be posted only using metal-wire "H- stakes" (2' x 2' campaign sign stakes) or wooden stakes no larger than 1" x 2".
- IV. No sign may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas if said sign is larger than 2 feet by 2 feet.
- V. No more than 2 signs per candidate or ballot item for each building entrance may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas.
- VI. No sign may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas within 100 feet of the entrance of a polling location.
- VII. Signs may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas in grassy areas only.
- VIII. No sign may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas in flower beds, driveways or parking lots.
- IX. No sign may be placed or otherwise situated upon property owned by Bastrop County, Texas sooner than 24 hours in advance of the beginning of early voting and or election day voting at the location.
- X. Signs must be removed within 24 hours after voting has ended at any property owned by Bastrop County, Texas.


